

Innsbruck Nature Film Festival: Call for entries to the INFF

The call is now open to filmmakers from all over the world to submit their works to Austria's one and only nature and environmental film festival.

The word is out: Submissions to the Innsbruck Nature Film Festival, INFF for short, are now open. As official representatives, festival director Johannes Kostenzer and festival curator Katja Trippel are calling on domestic and international filmmakers, producers and creatives everywhere to submit their works on nature, the environment and sustainability. Entries can be submitted right up until 10 May 2022 in a total of four categories: Nature Film, Environmental Documentary, Short Film and Animated Short Film.

Six special prizes will also be awarded to the 50 or so films selected for the competition, including the newly introduced best film on the topic of "Biodiversity in Agriculture" and the "Wild Women Award", which is unique in the industry and honours female directors and cinematographers.

The Innsbruck Nature Film Festival is endowed with €18,000 and will take place for the 21st time between 15-18 October 2022. INFF belongs to the Greenfilm Network (GFN), where it holds a leading position in the environment of over 40 fellow festivals. Supported by the city and tourism of Innsbruck, INFF stands out with a broad framework bringing together film creatives with locals and guests in an alpine-urban setting in the cinema, city and nature.
